	requiring them to comply with the order which has been done. This led us to pass Second order on 11^{th}		
		2018 directing the jurisdictional Pollution Control Board	
		to identify such of the industries according to which the	

statement made on behalf of the industrial association who was running industries releasing effluents which is more than the required quantity and resulting in the CETP unable to handle. We also authorize the Board to require all these industries to operate their Effluent Treatment Plants (in short ETPs) to ensure that the effluent which is being released is within the prescribed parameters, failing which the industry is required to be shutdown. We had asked periodical report to be filed in this regard by the Board.

The Learned Counsel appearing for the Board draws our attention to the report which is nothing but two line data without any opinion of the Board. This is highly deprecated as a Board has not understood the seriousness of the directions issued by the Tribunal.

Be that as it may, as rightly pointed out by the applicant's counsel that CETP has failed to become functional and in view of it the ensuing monsoon season the situation is very alarming and undoubtedly will endanger the life of the several people who are residing in the vicinity.

In these circumstances, we direct the Pollution Control Board to forthwith ensure that such of the industries which were not operating their ETPs to the optimum capacity and such of industries which are releasing effluents, not meeting the prescribed parameters to be released, shall be shutdown forthwith and a report in this regard shall be filed to the Tribunal.

We direct the Superintendent of Police and SDM of the jurisdictional area to give necessary assistance to the officers of the Pollution Control Board who shall comply this order and report compliance before the Tribunal. As far as the CETP is concerned, though they have filed application seeking waiver of dispensing with the order to deposit a sum of Rs. 5 Crores. We are compelled to observe that for the lapses it has committed shall be exposed to a further liability of another Rs. 5 Crores.
