		meeting the requirements. We had also ordered for joint
		inspection report which has been submitted to us today.
		As far as Taloja CETP Co-operative Society management is
		concerned, they have not filed any response. The report
		speaks for itself defining on analysis the effluent discharge
		intake in the CETP and the parameters of the discharge at
		exit are the same thereby establishing CETP is totally non
		functional. We requested the Learned Counsel to give us

further information and during the course of such submission, he stated that industries in that area are discharging effluent more than what the CETP could On questioning as to when this problem handle. occurred, we are informed by categorical statement on behalf of the Taloja CETP Co-operative Society Limited that it is existing since 2013. We have forewarned the Learned Counsel to obtain instructions as we may proceed to pass orders. He submits that on instructions from the representative of the Taloja CETP Co-operative Society Limited it is from 2013 the industries connected with CETP and are discharging more effluent than the capacity of the CETP but in this regard Taloja CETP Co-operative Society Limited had approached MIDC and has also issued fresh tenders for improving the capacity of CETP. As regards tendering is concerned, even on the previous date, it was submitted but admittedly no further progress has been made.

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> The report reveals the parameters of the effluent discharge very high and alarming. It may also be placed on record, the discharge is directly going into the Creek wali from which the water is being used for drinking as well. The river involved is Kasardi River which is also grossly polluted as a consequence to such discharge. In the given circumstances, there has to be a appropriate order for immediate effective steps be taken by the Taloja CETP Co-operative Society Limited to forthwith stop the discharge which is not meeting the parameters fixed and also to prevent the ill affect on the environment, considering the period over 5 years since 2013. For the

Item No. 03 April 11, 2018 R present, we direct the Taloja CETP Co-operative Society Limited to deposit sum of Rs. 5 crore within a month with the jurisdiction District Magistrate who is directed to keep their amount in a separate fund subject to the further orders that may by passed by the Tribunal.

Meanwhile, the Taloja CETP Co-operative Society Limited is directed to commence the work of upgrading the CETP as is submitted today within a period of one month from now failing which they will be liable to such punitive action as is provided under National Green Tribunal Act apart from the law inforce. We further direct the Pollution Control Board to conduct the inspection after a period of one month for ascertaining as to whether the Taloja CETP Co-operative Society Limited has commenced work as directed in the order passed by Tribunal and submit the report.

We direct the Pollution Control Board to suggest such steps as may be necessary for taking effective steps for preventing discharge of the untreated water/ the effluent which are not meeting the parameters into the creek the river in the question for interim period till effective action is taken with regard to functioning of the CETP. The Pollution Control Board shall submit action taken with regard to such discharge once in a week to the Tribunal. The first report be submitted by next Thursday i.e. on 19th April, 2018 followed by every week's report. This case will be listed for considering the report of the Pollution Control Board on the dates specified above and the main case is concerned, it will be listed on 11th May, 2018. Item No. 03 April 11, 2018 R We further direct the senior most officer from the Pollution Control Board and also responsible officer from the Taloja CETP Co-operative Society Limited to be present.

As far as the State is concerned, we direct the representative of the State Environment Department to be present on the next date of hearing. We further direct that in respect of the member units shall ensure pre treatment of the effluent to meet the inlet/CCN norms before sending effluents to CEPT and to ensure compliance of this directions, the Pollution Control Board shall conduct inspection of such units and submit report along with the first report that is to be submitted on 19th April, 2018. We make it clear that if the order is not complied, punitive action will have to be taken against the Taloja Cooperative Society and the officer concerned.
